& climate.
3. That said disease of Chronic Diarrhoea brought  
on & merged into Bleeding Piles about  
September of 1862, on the march toward  
Gettysburg, in Md. by Kerpers Ferry,  
or near that time. The reason I know  
is that he had been detailed by  
my consent as a Regimental Quartermaster  
because his legs came down so that it  
was hard for him to do duty on

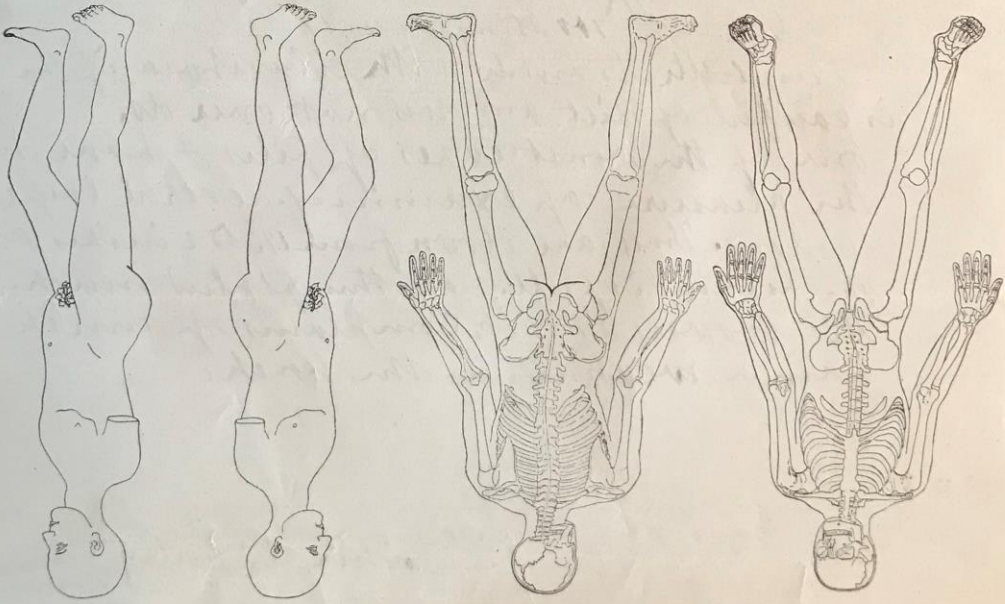

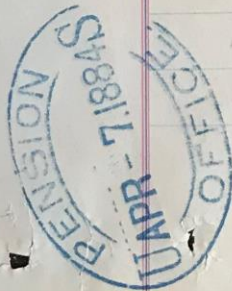

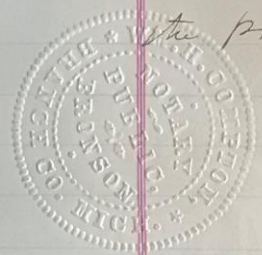

My post-office address is Medicine Lodge, Barber County, Kansas; I am 44 years of age; I was well and personally acquainted with the said Himbaugh prior to the war of the Rebellion we enlisted together; both of us enlisted in the above named Co. and Regt; were near neighbors at the time; I knew the said Himbaugh to be a man prior to the war, of good, sound physical health; during the time that we served the U.S. in said war, I often "bunked" with said Himbaugh Claimant; I knew the said Himbaugh to be in good health until we were engaged in taking up the Weldon Railroad in Va., during the month of August, A.D. 1864, at which time and place we both worked very hard, lifting and carrying away Railroad Iron, &c. It was at this place and at this time that I first heard said Himbaugh Claimant complain of his health, and I remember that he complained of having piles and Diarrhoea, and that the said Himbaugh there and then was excused from service regarding said

Railroad work and was sent to take care of and see to Colonel Throop's horses; & afterwards saw Claimant once or twice every week and being formerly neighbors and feeling exceedingly friendly with him, I would often ask him how he felt and we would talk together in regard to Hinbaugh's diseases or affliction. I further certify that I often saw the said Claimant after we had received our discharges from said U.S. Service, as I lived quite near him just across the State line, I living in Indiana and Claimant in Michigan - about six miles apart; we lived thus wise for about three years after the service of the U.S. as stated above; during these three years I knew Claimant to be still troubled with piles and Diarrhoea; I have not seen said Hinbaugh since A.D. 1868 or A.D. 1869.

WE HEREBY CERTIFY that in compliance with the requirements of the law\* we have carefully examined this applicant, who claims that while in the service of the United States at or near a place named Petersburg Va, and while in line of duty, on or about the day of August, 1864, he incurred Chronic Diarrhoea and Piles and that in consequence thereof he is 1/2 disabled for earning his subsistence by manual labor. His pulse-rate is 80 per minute; his respiration 28; his temperature 99°; his height is 5 feet and 6 1/4 inches; he weighs 147 1/2 pounds, and states that he is 48 years of age.

Touching the cause and degree of the disability for which he claims a pension, he makes the following statement: The disease came on gradually, after continuing for 3 weeks was sent to field hospital, remained there one day, then returned to regiment and light duty, continued in this condition until discharge Feb 28th 1865. Disease has continued to trouble him by spells ever since, has an attack every 2 to 3 weeks, lasting from 2 to 4 days. Piles came on soon after the first attack of diarrhoea & has continued ever since, they often come down, bleed, & become painful and swell, when he can hardly sit down in a chair.

The examination reveals the following objective facts in support of his statements: General appearance of fair health, muscular development good, fair, well nourished, skin normal, tongue red & smooth, liver normal, stomach normal, spleen tender on pressure, abdomen flat and tender over whole surface on pressure. Anus red, smooth, tender, and 2 large external pile tumors one on left & one on posterior surface of anus, tumors red tender and ulcerated; on digital examination of rectum we find from 4 to 6 tumors on posterior & lateral walls of bowel tender, inflamed & bleed readily on touch of finger, no prolapsus. Cardiac dulness 3 1/2 inches transversely, apex beat at 5 1/2 inches to right of nipple, impulse weak, rhythm irregular, friction murmur slight at base.

From the existing condition and the history of this claimant, as stated by himself, it is, in our judgment, probable that the disability was incurred in the service as he claims, and that it has not been aggravated or prolonged by vicious habits. He is, in our opinion, entitled to a 1/2 total rating for the disability caused by Chronic diarrhoea, 1/4 total for that caused by Piles, and 0 for that caused by 0 the sum of which aggregates Total. Dis. from ch. dia. remains about the same but disease of heart has increased. The least excitement or exercise, causes great difficulty of breathing and palpitation, and his nights are usually restless and but little sleep.  
Here give the claimant's statement as briefly and as compactly as possible.

Upon examination we find the following objective conditions: General appearance good. Muscles well developed. Well nourished. Skin clear soft, not sallow dry nor scragged. Tongue broad, soft, not swollen, dry nor fissured. Hepatic dulness beginning at 6 rib level not tender on pressure. Spleen flat & tender on pressure. Spleen normal. Abdomen flat except splenic flexure of colon which is distended & tender on pressure over splenic flexure which is tender on pressure. Anus red & on anterior & posterior surface is a tumor each large as almond purple tender, not ulcerated nor bleeding. Rectum on examination with speculum find surface above tumors red congested blood vessels engorged, no other tumors no ulcers no bleeding no false prolapsus any. Cardiac dulness 3 inches, apex at 5th space in nipple line, impulse strong, rhythm irregular, bellows murmur with first sound heard loudest at apex, disease of heart organic probably caused by chronic diarrhoea.

From the existing condition and the history of this claimant, as stated by himself, it is, in our judgment, probable that the disability was incurred in the service as he claims, and that it has not been prolonged or aggravated by vicious habits. He is, in our opinion, entitled to a 4/18 rating for the disability caused by Chronic Diarrhoea, 4/18 for that caused by Disease of rectum, and 4/18 caused by Disease of heart.
