I hereby certify, That I have carefully examined *Gideon Moser* who was a *Private Co "E"* *25 Regt. Pa. Vols.* in the war *Rebellion* and was granted an *Invalid Pension* under Certificate No. *130137*, to be paid now at the Agency in *Philadelphia*, by reason of alleged disability resulting from *G. S. M. Head* which he states to have been received in the line of duty while he was in the military service of the United States.

In *my* opinion the said Pensioner's disability, from the cause aforesaid, continues at *\$13 per month* **15**

A more particular description of the Pensioner's condition is subjoined:
Height, *5ft 5in*; weight, *155*; complexion, *Fair*; age, *37*; respiration, *19*; pulse, *76*.

Ball entered above right eye (3/4 of an inch) and lodged in brain, above the eye I find a cavity half an inch deep. Claimant states that the deafness is increasing. He appears to be very deaf. His conversation and demeanour substantiate the fact of his almost total deafness.

It is hereby certified, that Gideon Mead, formerly a Private of Captain Jacob D. Arnes, Company, in the 28th Regt. Penn^a Vols., who, it appears by the accompanying Certificate, was placed on the pension roll at the rate of Fifteen Dollars per month, on account, as he states, of having deafness result of gunshot wound of head, received while in the line of his duty, in the said service, on or about the 27th day of November, A. D. 1863, at a place called Ringgold, Georgia, is not only still disabled in consequence of the said injury, but in my opinion, his disability to obtain his subsistence by manual labor has increased, since his last examination September, A. D. 1875, so that it now amounts to nearly total disability; the said increased disability originating entirely from the injury or disease on account of which he was originally pensioned.

aged 38 years, a resident of Coaldale, in the County
and State aforesaid, who, being duly sworn according
to law, declares that he a pensioner of the United
States, duly enrolled at the Philadelphia, Penna.,
pension Agency, at the rate of Fifteen Dollars,
per month, by reason of disability incurred in
the military service of the United States, who was
a Private of Co. "E," of the 28th Regt, Penna. Vols; and
that his present physical condition is such that he
believes himself entitled to receive an increased
pension provided for in the pension Act, in such
cases made by Congress.

He further declares that he is disabled in the
following manner, to wit: Deafness, result of gun
shot wound of head, which has increased since
the above pension was granted to me, and has
increased wonderfully since the operation in
September, A. D. 1875, and the ball has not been
extracted out of his head, which causes him pain,
and totally disables him for doing manual
labor at such times, and nearly totally disables
him for manual labor on account of his deafness.

It is hereby certified That Gidem Moser formerly a Private of Captain (E) Company in the 28th Regiment of P.V.I., in the war of 1861 who is now paid at Philadelphia P.O. Agency at the rate of 13 dollars per month, on account, as he states, of 9.5 W of head

while in the line of duty in the military service of the United States, on or about the 27 day of November, 1863, at a place called Russell, in the State or Territory of Georgia is still suffering in consequence of said W.W.

The disability originates entirely from the injury or disease on account of which he was originally pensioned, as follows:

Height, 5 5/8; weight, 154 lbs; complexion, Fair
age, 38 1/2; respiration, 23; pulse, 88
W.W.

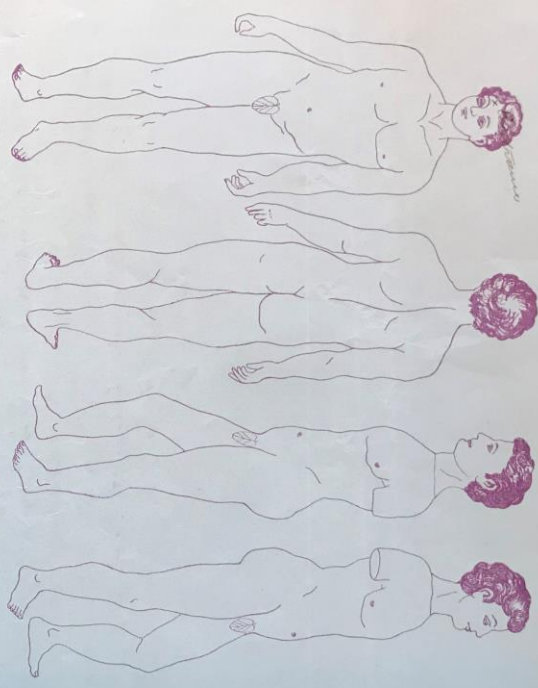
