A. P. Alexander, Pension Atty. who

we have been unable to learn
if all the evidence submitted
to him was forwarded to Washington.

I am in need of this pension to
help me along in my old age
and am very sincere when I ask
how I can get about to secure
an allowance since I am a widow
the second time.

I think you must admit that the first evidence submitted shows clearly that Jacob Vogle, my first husband, was a soldier and all that I claimed him to be.

Also that my son Edward F. Vogle was entitled to a pension until the proper age, as well as myself.

I am very sorry that both doctors are dead and I cannot secure their evidence which would surely establish all necessary facts beyond doubt.

Being unable to secure their evidence, is there anything else I can do to secure my pensions.

She is quite old now and would be grateful + feel that she was receiving justice after all these years if it was allowed her now.

Would she receive any back pension or would it just begin from date granted? The title given the claim

Commissioner of Pensions:

Regarding your letter of June 25,
you say my mother is not entitled
to a pension because of her second
marriage.

She is the soldier's widow and
has been a widow over four
years since the death of my
father her second husband.

Now we understand that a
woman who has been a soldier's
wife (widow) and remarries and
again becomes a widow thro the

death of her second husband
 may draw a pension. This is
 the exact case of my mother.
 She had never had a pension
 at all, or her child by soldier
 husband. But according to Act of
 April 1948 all soldiers widows
 were to receive pensions. Why not
 my mother?

Madam:

In response to your inquiry of the 10th instant, received the 14th, and filed in the above-cited rejected claim for pension, under the general law, you are informed that the act of April 19, 1908, does not give title to pension to widows who have remarried since the death of the soldier on account of whose service pension is claimed.

As your mother remarried after the death of the soldier, Jacob Vogle, she would have no title to pension under said act nor under the act of June 27, 1890.
