The 2019 Wertman Family Reunion focuses on at least six Wertman related family members who participated in the greatest battle that has ever taken place on the North American Continent — Gettysburg. It is known as the turning point of the Civil War. Please consider bringing your children and grandchildren for the opportunity to learn about their own and this country's history by being there. This sort of history is not taught in schools!

On 4 March 1861, Abraham Lincoln stood at the United States Capitol to deliver his first Inaugural Address. Trying to prevent a war that was to come, he said, "Though passion may have strained, it must not break our bonds of affection. over this broad land, will yet swell the chorus of the Union, when again touched, as surely they will be, by the better angels of our nature." He was talking about Revolutionary War patriots who fought to create this nation.

Perhaps similar mystic chords of memory, but from our many Wertman relatives who fought to preserve this Union, will stretch forth from every battlefield and grave to your living heart. The Wertman soldiers in blue came from Pennsylvania, New York, Michigan, Illinois, Wisconsin, Iowa and Ohio, and would serve in Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Tennessee, West Virginia, and Virginia. Some were captured, some wounded, many fell seriously ill, and at least three were laid to rest in national military cemeteries far from their families.

Forms change and pass; bodies disappear; but spirits linger, to consecrate ground for the vision-place of souls. And reverent men and women from afar, and generations that know us not and that we know not of, heart-drawn to see where and by whom great things were suffered and done for them, shall come to this deathless field, to ponder and dream; and lo! The shadow of a mighty presence shall wrap them in its bosom, and the power of the vision pass into their souls."

Please come to Gettysburg in September and join us at the reunion events. Let our families' soldiers' vision pass into your soul.

### Sergeant Albert P. Wertman

As a regular browser through online auction sites, I sometimes find family pieces. This year I discovered a photograph of Albert P. Wertman from the Historic Images Store on Ebay.

A label on the back of the photograph says, "Cleveland Bureau, Cleveland, Ohio: This un-posed photograph tells the story of the return home of former POW Sgt. Albert P. Wertman, 23, as he embraces his mother, Mrs. Mabel Wertman. Mrs. Wertman, who moved to Bridgeport, Conn, after a divorce, came here to greet her son who resides here with his father, Charles V. Wertman. Sgt. Wertman was captured in February 1952 while on an outpost in Korea. United Press Photo 9/15/53."

Newspaper archives at Http://interactive.ancestry.com/7751/NEWS-OH-LI\_NE.1953\_09\_16 show that this photograph appeared in the Lima News, Lima, OH, 16 Sep 1953 with the caption shown.

What can we find about this man?



"MY SON!" - This un-posed photograph doesn't actually need a caption, the picture tells the story: Sgt. Albert P. Wertman, home from a Korean prison camp, surprised his mother, Mrs. Mabel Wertman, when he walked in the door of their Cleveland, Ohio, home unannounced. As the sergeant, a prisoner for 18 months, walked in, his mother stared in disbelief, then cried, "My son!" Wertman had sent a telegram to his father, announcing his arrival, but somehow it did not reach Mr. Wertman.

In the June 2018 Wertman Lines, we provided some information about Jacob Wertman, who moved with his family to Tuscarawas County, OH, ca 1855. We do not know how he is related, but we have a DNA match. Jacob was a shoemaker, and later, a farmer. Jacob and Sarah (Harris) had 12 children. Nine moved with their parents to Tuscarawas Co. #### Jacob Wertman

I found no primary data on Jacob and no birth or death dates. However, he was included in two references: the Combination Atlas Map of Tuscarawas, Ohio, compiled, drawn, and published from personal examinations and surveys, by L.H. Everts & Co.; and First Centennial Atlas of Tuscarawas County Ohio: including a map of the state of Ohio, 1875, pg 173. An obituary for Jacob Wertman [senior], unknown newspaper, dated Mar 1889: "Twelve children were born to them; ten of whom are still living."

# Other Wertman Families of NE Ohio and NW Pennsylvania

Several families with the Wertman and similarly spelled surnames moved to NE Ohio and NW Pennsylvania in the early 1800s. We have attempted to correlate these families with other Wertman clans. Some new information has been discovered that may help, but more research is needed.

# Peter Musser (1740-1808) and Margaret (Wurtman, Wortman) (1743-1821)

This family came to Ohio *ca* 1801, locating in Columbiana Co., very near the Pennsylvania border. They founded the town of Petersburg. They previously lived near Hagerstown, MD. We have no information on Margaret's family. Some Musser/Moser/Mosser family researchers believe they are related to the Mossers who were neighbors of the Wertmans in Lynn Twp., Northampton Co., PA. Interestingly, Peter Musser's estate has a reference to a "Lutheran and Prisbiterian [sic]" congregation, not the more common Lutheran and Reformed union churches.

#### Jacob Wertman (1799-1871) and Rebecca Smith

This family lived in Lawrence County, PA, very close to the border and adjacent to Columbiana and Mahoning counties in Ohio. Initially, we discounted this family as being connected with the main Wertman tribe because they were involved in a Presbyterian church. This family and their Paden descendants had family reunions for many years. We found a 1915 newspaper article describing that year's reunion and some of the out-of-town guests -- including G. M. Wertman of Stoutsville, OH, and John Wertman, also of OH. G. M. Wertman (1867-1933) was my wife Brenda's grandfather, who was a grandson of the first Wertman in Pickaway Co., George Wertman (1805-1884). George's father, John (1836-1924), may have been the John at the reunion.

#### Michael Wertman (1765-1837)

Michael and his family were in Columbiana Co., OH, in 1810, and later moved to Liberty Twp., Trumbull Co., OH. He is buried in the same graveyard as several Wertman neighbors who migrated from Lynn Twp., Oswalds and Everetts. His wife was possibly an Ewig from Northumberland Co. Their descendants adopted the Wortman spelling. Some Wortmans still live in NE Ohio.
